The 29th of this month begins the Holy Week journey towards Easter beginning with Palm Sunday. For Christians this is the most significant and historic week in our faith. This year it marks the beginning of a big change for the pattern of worship as we dovetail our services into those of all Saints Roffey and St Saviour Colgate. We are beginning this experimentally and will review it as we go along. There will still be a service of Holy Communion at Rusper *every* Sunday. In a typical month of four Sundays the pattern will be as follows:

First Sunday 8am Said Eucharist

Second Sunday 11am Sung Eucharist

Third Sunday 8am Said Eucharist 9:30am Sung Eucharist

4th Sunday 11am Sung Eucharist

Easter reminds us of course that *every* Sunday is a weekly commemoration of the resurrection the first day of the week The beginning of new life.

This also presents an opportunity for us to worship in one another's churches to learn from one another's traditions and to grow together spiritually.

RUSPER CHRONICLE

We enjoyed an evening learning more about the Rusper Football Club which started in 1930.

The team first played on the Star Field which is where Cooks Mead is today, the field was loaned by Mr & Mrs Holroyd of Rusper House, lots of notes refer to drainage and filling in holes, so no different than today! Mitchell Coaches transported the team to away matches.

A pavilion was built at the cost of £47 and opened in May 1937.

When it was decided to build Cooks Mead the team moved to a field on land at The Nunnery, Sir Cecil Hurst (who owned the Nunnery) was always President of the club unto his death in 1963.

After WW2 it was decided to continue with the club although it was difficult to get enough players. Faygate FC invited Rusper players to join them as both clubs didn't have enough players, Rusper loaned Faygate the goal posts and line marker.

In the 1955/56 season Rusper were 2nd Division League champions and we were fortunate to have a couple of black and white photographs, which were taken outside the Plough of the team and supporters.

In the early 1960s the team moved to their present ground in the village, the land being leased from the Hurst Estate, which it still is today.

Our next meeting will be on the 10th March at 7.00pm in the village hall. Everyone welcome.

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

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RUSPER PARISH COUNCIL

Parish Council Update: Key Issues and Decisions

At the latest Parish Council meetings, councillors discussed a wide range of matters affecting Rusper, including district finances, flooding, road safety, community facilities, open spaces, and planning applications. A summary of the most relevant points for residents is set out below.

District Council Update

District Councillor Tony Hogben reported on the latest budget from Horsham District Council. The budget includes an increase of just under 3%, alongside capital investment totalling more than £30 million. A significant project is the refurbishment of the Capitol Theatre, currently closed, with estimated costs of around £22 million.

Income from council tax, parking, and property remains relatively low, and Government Grant funding continues to play an important role.

However, grant funding this year is approximately 5% lower than last year. Food waste collection is not fully subsidised, although £1.6 million more funding has been received than initially expected.

Councillors raised questions about whether residents are required to use food waste bins or can opt out. Cllrs Tony Hogben and Sam Raby will seek clarification on this issue.

Flooding and Road Safety - Flooding on the A264

Members were informed that the A264 remains closed due to flooding, originating near Holmbush. A request has been made to reopen at least one lane as soon as possible. Traffic is currently diverted through Rusper, adding pressure to local roads. At Faygate, water is being diverted into a nearby field, though flooding risks remain.

Road Safety Concerns

Serious concerns were raised about pedestrian safety, particularly near new housing developments where construction traffic is increasing. Narrow pavements, large vehicles, and unsuitable road layouts are creating dangerous conditions for residents, including children & animals.

Highways and Development Impacts

Councillors discussed cumulative highways impacts linked to local developments, including construction traffic management, diversion routes, traffic calming measures (such as speed humps and pinch points), and extending the Traffic Regulation Order along East Street. A meeting will be arranged with West Sussex County Council Highways

to raise these concerns. The Clerk will also look at how best to keep residents informed about safety measures and disruption.

Financial Matters

The Council approved: December financial reconciliation, budget report, and bank statements

Approval was also given for the purchase and replacement of two public defibrillators—one outside Rusper Stores and one at the Recreation Ground—with professional installation.

Planning Matters - Recent Applications

2 Normans Cottages, High Street – Listed Building Consent for replacement wooden flush windows. No objection raised.

The Willow Tree, Faygate Lane – Single-storey extension, garage replacement, and landscaping. No comment.

Hurst Hill, Topham Farm, Rusper Road – Agricultural storage building. No comment, as permission already granted by HDC.

1 Hilltop Cottages, The Mount, Ifield – Five single-storey self/custom-build dwellings. The Parish Council objected, citing excessive scale and density, harm to countryside character, access and construction traffic concerns, impacts on grazing animals, and conflict with the Neighbourhood Plan. The absence of footpaths, equestrian use of the road, and an existing dog kennel business opposite the site were also highlighted. An enforcement case on the site remains outstanding.

Winterfold Farm, Wimland Road – Variation to a previously approved equestrian worker dwelling. No comment.

Appeals

An appeal to the Planning Inspectorate was reviewed concerning land to the rear of The Rectory, High Street, Rusper, for nine new dwellings. Any further objections will be finalised and submitted by 21 January 2026.

Open Spaces Committee Update

Fingerposts

The fingerpost cleaning and refurbishment programme is continuing, with councillors maintaining adopted posts. The Committee agreed the programme should continue.

Defibrillators

The Committee confirmed that the existing cabinet outside the village shop does not need replacement. To improve coverage, an additional defibrillator at the Sports Club was recommended, subject to landowner consent. A quotation of £1,434 was received from WelMedical to replace

the original unit and supply a second defibrillator with a cabinet. This recommendation will go to Full Council.

Rusper Recreation Ground

Maintenance, safety, and security were discussed. Issues noted included:

- A hedge and 40mph sign lost due to a car accident (the sign will be reported to Highways)
- A dead tree near the entrance requiring assessment
- Vehicles accessing the pitch at night

The Committee recommended installing two bollards near the pavilion as a safety measure. The Sports Club underlease and reporting arrangements were discussed, alongside a recent accessibility complaint regarding the tennis courts. It was recommended that the lease and relationship agreement be formally signed and that the Sports Club Chair attend a Parish Council meeting to discuss regular reporting.

Rights of Way

An update was received on the long-term closure of Footpath 1492. Councillors White and Sallows will meet with the Public Rights of Way team to discuss next steps.

Community and Other Updates

- The Speed Indicator Device on Horsham Road has been installed
- The Gatwick report was received and noted
- A village litter-picking event is scheduled for 12 April 2026
- Car park pothole repairs (£450) will be arranged
- Residents continue to raise concerns about speeding
- Plans are underway for the Annual Parish Meeting on 28 May 2026.

SAVE WEST OF IFIELD CAMPAIGN

Horsham District Council (HDC) has announced that the **Planning Inspector has agreed to re-open the examination hearings for Horsham's draft Local Plan**. The original hearings were closed in December 2024 because the Planning Inspector at the time was concerned that the volume of new housing proposed in the draft Plan was too low, but the lifting of the water neutrality requirements is a game-changer, and HDC now appears to be committed to allocating significantly more sites into an updated draft Local Plan.

At the time of writing – 14th February – we don't yet know what this means for the **West of Ifield (WOI) planning application**. If the application process continues over the spring and summer, it feels as if there could be three sets of Local Plan policies that the application could be judged against – the 2015 adopted Plan (HDPF), the existing (2024) draft Plan, and the modified version of the draft Plan which will emerge over the next five months. How confusing! Perhaps the decision on the WOI application will be delayed until the Plan is redrafted and passed by the Planning Inspector? We have always argued that a development the size of WOI should receive the scrutiny of an Inspector's examination of a new Plan.

The timetable for the redrafted Plan seems ambitious, with consultation July-August and examination hearings in September– see the Local Plan Flow Diagram linked here: <https://www.horsham.gov.uk/planning/local-plan/local-plan-examination/Latest-News-from-Local-Plan-Examination>
