

#### **Harvest of Souls**

We think of Harvest Thanksgiving as a tradition steeped in antiquity, but the English rural idyll it suggests was a Victorian invention, itself a nostalgic feeling for a world vanishing beneath the growing industrial landscape. My kinsman and former Rector of Rusper, John Wood was 'very easy in his demands for tithes' while his successor and cannier nephew, while at the same time standing up for the agricultural workers of the 1830s remained happy to take his full share under the unpopular system.

Today the gifts from village and largely our school have for many years gone to support the sadly increasing needs that Crawley Open House was set up to alleviate. The fairly recent spectacle of the current Rector publicly eating from a dog food can is a memorable image highlighting a serious and under the current Government, growing crisis for the poor.

Something that unites street people, sofa surfers and the more fortunate in society is our love of animal companionship and we look forward to meeting all creatures great and small at what has now, probably thanks to Dawn French become the annual village event of the church pet service.

Nothing however is more unifying than our essential mortality. At the end of this month, we celebrate the Christian hope in the Resurrection and pray by name for departed loved ones, those who have publicly professed the faith and those whose faith is known to God alone in his mercy.

From the beginning of the month there will be a chantry list for you I church to add the names of any departed ones you would like us to remember at the altar on that occasion.

#### RUSPER VILLAGE HALL REFURBISHMENT

We are delighted to announce that after several years of fund raising within our community and a generous grant from the Hope Keith Trust, work has commenced on the refurbishment of Rusper Village Hall.

The initial phase comprises the replacement of the roof tiles including the



fitting of insulation to keep the building warm and reduce heating costs. This work is estimated to last from 8-10 weeks and the car park at the rear of the building will be out of use during this time. Inside the building it will be business

as usual apart from the inevitable extra noise as work progresses.

The second phase of work will focu" on 'he redevelopment of the former snooker room into a "hub" area renamed as "The Hope Keith Room" and aimed specifically at Rusper's elderly residents who are currently unable to use our facilities during weekday daytimes as the School and the Playgroup make full use of the two halls during these times. We hope that work will start this during the Autumn and will include provision of a disabled toilet and wheelchair access via the front door.

#### RUSPER CHRONICLE

#### POSTCARDS

"One more for your Collection" writes an unnamed correspondent from "Oaklee" in Rusper to her friend Miss Robins in Kentish Town in January 1918 – but she is pleased to report that she got a pound of cheese as easy as winking but no butter (shades of war-time food shortages?) Oh, and Reg apparently sent good wishes also. The picture on the front of the card is an interior of Rusper Church published by Walter Martin of Rusper Stores.

This is rather typical of the messages sent by postcard in the early 1900s. There were no postcards before 1895 as the Post Office did not allow pictures on a card. Originally only the address was to be on the reverse so even when pictures were first allowed there was nowhere to write a message – until the back was divided into two parts. But it was probably the coming of the halfpenny stamp which started the postcard passion, a means of communicating for everybody to use – and to collect. It lasted till the First World War, though cards produced by Walter Martin at Rusper Stores were still circulating in the 1920s, perhaps as a form of advertising his business.

Collecting postcards is still popular today, as we found at the Rusper Chronicle meeting in September when both Jean Wood's and Derek White's albums were there for exploring, together with old Property for Sale catalogues and the Tithe Map.

Imagine the poor photographer cycling up to Rusper, perhaps from Faygate Station, on his trusty steed looking for something to photograph. Some things were certainties like the church and the pubs but a lot of Rusper was a building site. Walter King was busy replacing the old cottages by the church with his new ones, old Puckscroft was getting an Edwardian frontage, Normans was becoming a large Edwardian house instead of a simple farmhouse, small houses were falling down and becoming 'unfit for human habitation' like Old Park Farm (one of the oldest houses in the village) – so no wonder he didn't make it each time to more remote areas like Friday Street and Lambs Green. Others like the shop were new so maybe not so attractive? Maybe too some householders were not keen to have their properties made public. For whatever reason the coverage of the parish is mixed.

subscribe: www.rusper-pc.org.uk. The combined Planning and Council Meeting took place on the 29<sup>th</sup> August 2023 Rusper Village Hall. Agreed responses to the following planning applications. Apologies

Cllrs K Nagle (WSCC), Cllrs T Hogben (HDC), V Hanstad-Pilcher.

#### **Declaration of Interests**

Members were reminded to make any declarations of a personal and/or pecuniary interest that they may have in relation to items on the agenda.

No declarations were made.

#### **Climate Emergency**

To **acknowledge** that there is currently a climate emergency, and to ensure that all decisions made within meeting have consideration to this.

#### Minutes of previous meeting

It was **RESOLVED** to approve the Minutes of the previous Council meeting.

#### **Open Forum**

4 members of the public were present. Andrew Cadnam Treasurer of CAGNE referred to Agenda item 7 and 22 in relation to the CAGNE grant application. Noted that papers were distributed in advance of the meeting. Questions relevant to the grant application were asked by the Parish Council. Strategy, recommendation, quotations were all noted and required feedback from CAGNE. Key concern is the Parish Council did not want to donate towards an endless project. Noted that noise reports paid for by CAGNE would be made available to the Parish Council once they are complete. *Agenda item 22 – to consider grant application from CAGNE was brought forward for consideration by the Chair of the Parish Council.* 

Proposal to commit up to £2000 on the basis of seeing documents on legal proposals. Noted that other Parishes have contributed similar amounts. Proposed by ClIr Sallows, seconded ClIr White all were in favour. Clerk to issue an email to CAGNE requesting the information and will report back at the next Parish Council meeting.

#### **Report from other Authorities**

District Councillor Liz Kitchen – noted the reasons for the dismissal of appeal at Bonwyks Farm and reasons for dismissal should be noted by the Planning Committee. Hope Keith Trust – noted that a volunteer has come forward to run the Age UK coffee morning and that the trust were looking to put funds towards the employment of a Noted there is a photo of Hope Keith available for the Parish Council to use. The Local Plan update Meeting on 4<sup>th</sup> September will be attended by the

District Councillors. There is no further news on water neutrality. It was reported that the Rusper Road has traffic lights and cones have been knocked over but no works seem to have been commenced. **Acon** Cllr S White to follow up and feedback to the Council.

#### **Active Planning Applications**

Chairman of the Planning Committee Cllr G Sallows chaired this section of the meeting. **Gatwick Planning Application for Emergency 2<sup>nd</sup> Runway** 

Noted that CAGNE wanted formal confirmation of representation to register an interest. It was proposed that the Council confirm their opposition to the runway and confirmed the support of CAGNE – all were in favour. **It was RESOLVED** that the Parish Council oppose the 2<sup>nd</sup> runway and confirm their support to CAGNE against the application for a 2<sup>nd</sup> runway.

#### **Operation Watershed – The Mount**

The Clerk reported that an increase in price is expected due to the me between quotes. Item to be carried as no response yet from Landbuild. Clerk to report back at the next meeting. **Parking Outside Rusper Stores** Following approval at the last meeting, the Clerk reported that a white 'H' line had been requested from WSCC Highways following completion of the on-line ordering system with photos and measurements attached. The Clerk has spoken to the resident and Rusper Village Stores to engage on this issue. Carried to next meeting.

Removal of hedge West of Ifield - Carried to next meeting.

#### **Reports from Representatives**

Cllr M Fillmore – Gatwick - Jeremy Quin MP dialogue continues and is copied to the Clerk to be saved on the dropbox file. It was requested that Enforcement notices to be included on the Planning agenda again as a standard item, this was **agreed**.

Cllr G Adams – the salt bin report was submitted and there was a query that one bin was missing. This has been cross checked and the report is accurate to the number of bins within Rusper. Clerk to report back to HDC. Cllr F Maitland-Smith – HALC meeting attended at the end of July, the meeting was an AGM for HALC and a joint meeting of HALC and HDC, minutes have been circulated. HALC voted and agreed to a zoom as soon as LP is published to provide an HALC view on whether HALC supports the LP or not. Noted that the NPs cover 15 years but it has statutory power for 2 years which may be increased to 5 years. HALC to work together for cross Parish issues. John Milne, Marn Boffey, Catherine Howe were present at the joint meeting. Public questions had been removed from the HDC meeting agendas which was requested to be reversed. Helen Peacock Environment Officer Community and Nature reported that funds were available for bat boxes and swift boxes. The Clerk enquired about planning training for Parish Councillors which was likely to be held in October. Acon Clerk to chase the HDC planning training for Councillors.

Cllr R Gat – Village Hall roof has commenced. Hope Keith Trust have donated all the money for the roof. Extra funding will be used to refurb the Village Hall further such as the heating.

Cllr G Sallows – noted that there is an issue with water supply to the Pavilion and is to be repaired by Southern Water. **Acon** Clerk to write a letter Southern Water.

Cllr M Cooke – IT side for the Parish Council is being assessed. Subscribers for Parish Council website is 14 on the Facebook page there are 227 followers, the Village Facebook has 3300 followers. It is hoped to move the email to Outlook to help with the live calendar issue.

#### **Clerks Report**

Report items are covered within the Agenda with the exception of the complaint against closed Footpath 1549. A comprehensive response to the long-term closure and plan for this footpath was received by the Council. It was agreed that the Clerk can forward the report to the resident concerned about the footpath.

#### **Recreational Ground**

Noted that the Courage Dyers grant has been paid for the Pavilion refurbishment on 25<sup>th</sup> August. The Parish Council thank Courage Dyers for their kind support.

#### **Rusper Stores Recycling Bin**

Following approval at the previous meeting the Clerk reported the HDC recommended dual waste and recycling bin which is on a 5 weeks lead me. This will be delivered to Rusper Village Stores once it has been approved, HDC will then remove one waste bin following its installation outside Rusper Stores. Rusper Village Stores have been informed and have kindly agreed to take delivery of the item. **Acon** Clerk to contact Broxap.

#### **Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group**

Update by Cllr Maitland-Smith – last meeting was on 31<sup>st</sup> July and a new member joined. The group discussed the LP housing numbers which were lower than the previous draft, West of Ifield is expected to the allocated, the group discussed constraints on water supply, noted that Homes England may have to provide alternative Golf facility. Detail of resident's questionnaire which will go out after the group have seen the Local Plan. Date of the next meeting was 4<sup>th</sup> and will be rescheduled.

#### **Transport Survey**

The Transport Survey was received and **adopted** by the Council. **Acon** Clerk to find out what the payment covers and a breakdown and what is covered within the extra works. **TPO Summerswood Estate** It was **agreed** that a TPO would be requested again based upon the attached report. **Action** Clerk to reapply for a TPO on the line of trees.

#### Winter Offer Plan

The Council **agreed** to take up the offer. Clerk to write back to HDC with an updated Local Winter Plan. **Acon** Clerk to ensure that the salt bin email is confirmed as correct. Clerk to ask what roads in Rusper are gritted. Clerk to

issue Local Winter Plan no later than 10<sup>th</sup> November 2023, this will be reported back at the next meeting before release.

#### Financial

It was **RESOLVED** to approve the financial report, this was signed by the Chair.

It was **RESOLVED** to approve a grant of £2000 in principle for CAGNE following completion of the data requested by Cllr M Fillmore as minuted. The papers for the Village Hall roof grant were **noted** as **correct** and payment is to be issued as per the Grant application form.

It was **RESOLVED** to approve the schedule of payments, this was signed by the Chair with the exception of the extra work for Alan Bailes which has been carried until the Clerk has received further information.

#### SAVE WEST OF IFIELD CAMPAIGN

#### SAVE WEST OF IFIELD PUBLIC MEETING – 14<sup>th</sup> September

It was standing room only as more than 80 residents attended the SWOI AGM and public meeting in Rusper village hall.

The first of three guest speakers was Henry Smith, MP for Crawley, who ran through the reasons why the development was not viable – the unique character and heritage of the area, the impact on biodiversity and the unsustainable pressure on infrastructure such as roads, health services, public transport and water resources.

Henry said "This area has taken its fair share of new housing. Local people should not be called NIMBYs for pointing this out." He explained that government policy is that brownfield sites should be developed – not greenfield – and that there is in fact plenty of brownfield land in the south-east.

Henry will deliver his petitions against the West of Ifield development to Parliament in October or November, and he encouraged the campaign not to give up: "The Homes England plans can be defeated."

The next speaker was Simon Collins of the River Mole Watch group. Simon reminded us that the Mole actually rises just south of Rusper village, and that much of Rusper, Colgate and Crawley is in the Upper Mole catchment. The West of Ifield site is in a valley of impermeable clay soil surrounded by hills and ridges – hence its' a 'wet spot' (WSCC classification) and a Flood Risk Area (Environment Agency). Homes England have yet to provide detail on how they would mitigate the flood risk, and to what extent they are taking account of it increasing due to climate change. Simon explained how development can increase flood risk, sewage overflows and other pollution and how this will adversely affect areas downstream in Surrey. The Mole is already a stressed river, with nine major sewage works discharging into it and for much of its length running through urban areas. Urbanising one of the remaining rural sections threatens the whole river still further.

The final speaker was Alison Cornell, West Sussex County Councillor, who spoke about the horrendous impact of the plans on road layout and traffic volumes across a wide area. Homes England may claim that people will walk or cycle rather than use their cars – the so-called 15-minute neighbourhood – but there is no evidence at all that this might happen. In fact there will be thousands of additional car journeys a day, many rat-running through the small roads of Rusper and Crawley. Alison also noted the lack of any sensible regional planning process.

Questions and points from the floor covered a wide range of topics. Fenella Maitland-Smith (SWOI Chair) and Cathy Durrant (SWOI Treasurer) presented their annual reports as part of the AGM and thanked all those who had helped the campaign. They also set out the future challenges and need for everyone to keep writing to Horsham Council with their objections, and the need for funding.
