'What do we ask of life, here or indeed hereafter, but leave to serve, to live, to commune with our fellow men and with ourselves; and from the lap of earth to look up into the face of God?'

The book from which these lines come was not published until six months after the death of the author aged only 32. Margaret Fairless Barber was without doubt a mystic writer. It is a common misunderstanding to assume that such people as we call mystics are of some strange breed, inhabiting a monastic cloister or the other worldly equivalent. An orphan at twenty, Margaret was a nurse in the slums of Victorian London and only her own ill health forced her to give up that practical work to which she was so devoted. The compensation for our benefit was that she turned to writing. Moving to Sussex she befriended outsiders, the homeless and those with learning difficulties. in her classic book *The Roadmender* she weaves stories of these ordinary people into a divine purpose. she sees their beauty and intrinsic value. The writing was a labour of love completed by dictation as she became almost completely blind. Mysticism is grounded and poetic faith finds fulfilment in practical ways. Margaret chose anonymity in the pen name Michael Fairless. Only some 20 years after her death did some amateur sleuthing identify her and locate her resting place in the churchyard at Ashurst. This remarkable author writing within earshot of the Carthusian monastery at Cowfold

stands in the medieval tradition of Julian of Norwich. The Cowfold Carthusians were refugees from France in the 1870s.

Against the background of historic spiritual tradition her gender neutrality makes her an unconventional 'saint' for our modern times. Our subject this month, Margaret died on the 24th of August 1901.

The emblem of the Carthusians is depicted as a globe surmounted by a cross. Emblazoned above it are seven stars which represent St Bruno and his six companions, founders of the order. The Latin motto is translated as the cross stands while the world revolves

JOHN OICKLE 1947-2022

We were out walking one day and we came across a man in a fluorescent jacket picking up litter. We assumed this was a very efficient 'council worker'. Instead, this was John Oickle, a Lambs Green resident who regularly went around the roads in Rusper – as far as Bonnetts Lane – with his truck, picking up litter. This litter encompassed not only the usual crisp packets etc., but road signs left by Highways, paint pots, supermarket baskets, tyres, metal poles – the list goes on. This he transported home to await collection by HDC.

John was born in Dorking and grew up in Abinger Hammer. He was a farmer and builder and loved the outdoors competing in grass track races. He and his family moved to Rusper in 2006 and John and his wife had a strong work ethic and a desire to help others. For instance, they worked together to raise money to buy Christmas presents for locally disadvantaged children. He competed in a 24km race over the Brecon Beacons on one of the hottest days of the year and successfully completed the course – at 70 years old! – again raising money for a children's charity. He was a retained fire fighter, renovated tractors, and loved playing with his grandchildren. John was looking forward to being involved on the Road and Traffic Committee. He was good company and made many friends over the years who will really miss him.

John enjoyed keeping our roads and paths cleared of litter immensely and found it very satisfying. He was a man with big hands and an even bigger heart. Rusper will miss him.

Hi there.

It's hot, very hot! Just a reminder that frequent hydration and keeping cool are the priorities in a heat wave.

Some hot weather guidance

DATE OF NEXT MEETING: TUESDAY 13TH SEPTEMBER, 7-9 pm RUSPER VILLAGE HALL when we will continue looking at the lives of ordinary people of Rusper in the past.

We had such an enjoyable July meeting on this theme. We are so lucky that in the group we have members of two families whose names go back several centuries - the Pratt family and the Steere family, and Linda and Harold kept us fascinated. Harold retold the story of his uncle Gilbert Steere who at the age of 19, with no pilot training, managed to fly a Halifax bomber back from an air raid when the pilot was shot and died. And for which Gilbert was awarded the Conspicuous Gallantry Medal. Meanwhile Linda's father was serving as a Desert Rat under General Erskine who is buried in Rusper Churchyard and whose grave we looked at on the previous Chronicle meeting held in the church and churchyard. The Pratt family were farmers so Lynn gave us a look at the importance of farming when Rusper was almost entirely a farming village. A recording of John Penfold singing in the Plough to Vaughan Williams in the early 1900s introduced us to John who was the publican at the time – and had married a member of the Pratt family. The history of places is so often told only through the history of the big houses, partly because they are more documented, but what about the story of the "ordinary" families - not ordinary at all! If you have any history of your local family we would like to share it! Everyone is welcome at our meetings – just come along.

Planning – 21st June 2022

Responses to planning applications

<u>DC/22/0929 West Laing, Horsham Road</u>: Defer to the arboricultural officer but would request that Highways takes a view on this application as the trees border the road.

DC/22/0891 East Lodge, Ifield Hall: No objections provided that:-

- Water saving measures are applied to the main dwelling and the annexe.
- The building remains annexed to the main residence for habitation purposes.

<u>DC/22/0949 Kilnwood Farmhouse, Kilnwood Lane</u>: Opposed to this application as there is insufficient information provided, especially relating to water neutrality. If the officer is minded to approve this application, Rusper PC requests that:-

- The number of horses at the site or surrounding the site remain at a reduced level as the water neutrality plan is based on this.
- The impact on the SSSI at House Copse should be a key consideration for the Environmental Officer.
- There is nothing in the plans to show how grey water storage would be achieved. There should be a condition added that this is in the plans and in use before anyone takes occupancy.
- Any outside lighting should comply with the dark skies policy in the Rusper Parish Neighbourhood Plan.

Appointment of roles

It was agreed to appoint Cllr Gatt to the role of Village Hall Committee representative.

Street light contract

It was agreed to appoint Streetlights as contractors to maintain the lighting, and this will be reviewed after a year when a plan will be put in place to remove streetlights in that time.

Playground

It was noted that there are two dead elm trees in the playground which will be looked at to see if a quote is needed to remove them. There is no immediate risk posed to the public due to their location.

The fallen wall bordering the playground will be finished as soon as possible.

Police

The Police Liaison Document was approved and will be published on the website and Facebook page. Councillors were encouraged to talk to their neighbours about this and report all crime.

Correspondence/Consultations/Reports/Meetings

a. An informal meeting was held with Colgate Parish Council to discuss the Land West of Ifield strategic site.

- b. The email regarding the Shared Prosperity Fund was noted. The following items will be reported to them: Rusper Village Hall needs renovation including a new roof and insulation, the sports court at the Rusper Recreation Ground needs replacing, there is a plan to calm traffic in the High Street in Rusper which needs funding.
- c. The attendees for meeting Cllr Chowen on 4th July will be Cllrs Hussey, Sallows and Maitland-Smith.
- d. The attendees for meeting with Horsham District Council regarding golf provision will be Cllrs Hanstad-Pilcher and Maitland-Smith. The Captain of Ifield Golf Club will also be invited.
- e. Cllrs Hussey and Hanstad-Pilcher will be meeting the Highways Area Manager to review and log all of the road issues.

 to put together detailed statistics to refute what Gatwick Airport are
 saying about night flights.

- Cllr Cooke attended the Horsham District Older People's Forum.


