SAVE WEST OF IFIELD CAMPAIGN

Thank you to everyone who turned out in the cold on 5th January to protest at Homes England serving notice on **Ifield Golf Club** for vacant possession in April 2027. Why they chose to do this just before Christmas is a mystery, and completely at odds with their claims to be working with the community. Between 150 and 200 local people attended the protest, which was widely reported in the local press.

There are now 525 responses from the public to Homes England's planning application for the West of Ifield scheme, published on the Horsham Council website, almost all objections. This is fantastic, and we encourage everyone to **continue to submit views**, given **Horsham Council's Planning Committee is unlikely to consider the application before March**. Homes England are due to submit a lot of new information, as requested by the official consultees, and the Council can't make a decision until this has been published and consultees had a chance to respond again.

You're probably aware, but since I wrote my last piece both **Gatwick Airport Ltd. and Crawley Council have strongly objected** to the application. Gatwick objects on a number of grounds, but particularly on future noise: "The proposed development is contrary to national and local planning policy and guidance on aircraft noise and would be better located elsewhere where future aircraft noise levels associated with future growth at the airport are lower. GAL strongly objects to the proposed development on this basis."

Crawley Council objects on many grounds including the lack of a Local Plan for Horsham, the lack of consideration of local character, damage to the Ifield Village Conservation Area and surrounding rural landscape, inadequate provision of affordable housing, inadequate mitigation for the loss of Ifield Golf Course, and inadequate mitigation for increased traffic burden.

Given Crawley and Gatwick's proximity and relevance to the site, their institutional importance, and the nature of the issues they raise, their objections must surely carry a very significant weight. It's also notable that most of their issues cannot be corrected or mitigated by Homes England in a revised application – they are fundamental flaws with the site.

As well as continuing to work on our follow-up responses to the planning application, we've also submitted a **formal complaint to Homes England**. While this doesn't contain new arguments, it is another channel through which we can make our voices heard. If Homes England's response is unsatisfactory we can ask our MPs to pursue this with the Parliamentary Ombudsman. Please let me know if you would like to see the detailed complaint.

Rusper Parish Council – January 2025 Update

New Playground Equipment

The village playground on High Street has welcomed a brand-new piece of equipment, made possible through the generous support of the Courage Dyers Trust and the Parish Council. The Council extends its gratitude to the Courage Dyers Trust and commends Cllr Geoff Hussey for his dedicated project management, working closely with supplier Wicksteed Ltd to bring the installation to life.

Council Meeting Highlights – 25th November 2025

The Parish Council met at Rusper Village Hall. Key points included:

- **Finance:** The Parish Council approved the latest financial reports, payment schedules, and earmarked reserves. The Budget and Precept for 2026/27 were set at £70,920, reflecting a c10.8% increase in the Precept. In addition, a grant of £2,000 was awarded to GACC to support their Judicial Review regarding Gatwick Airport.
- **Policies & IT:** Updated IT, accessibility, and data protection policies were adopted. The Council will transition fully to the new .gov.uk website and email system by 31 December 2025.
- **Rusper Sports Club:** Updates were received on the underlease, financial reporting, and pitch security following unauthorised vehicle access. Bollards are due to be installed soon.
- **Roads, Footpaths & Open Spaces:** Progress on fingerpost maintenance and the Liz Kitchen Memorial Bench was noted. The Council approved the installation of a Speed Indicator Device (SID) on Horsham Road.

DC/25/1952	Howells Gill, Friday Street – Mobile home (Proposed LDC)	Neutral – No objection, provided it is ancillary, does not cause overdevelopment, and drainage/environmental matters are addressed.

Gatwick & Local Updates

The Council noted the publication of a Gatwick report on the Parish website. Reports on local assets, car park maintenance, energy supply, and village hall updates were also received.

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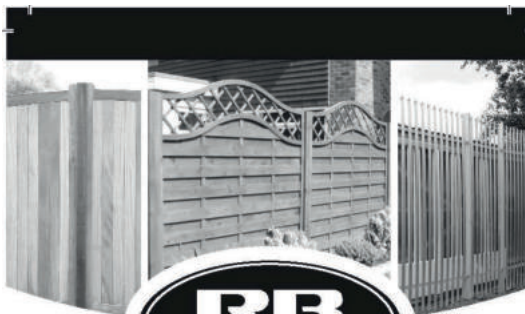
