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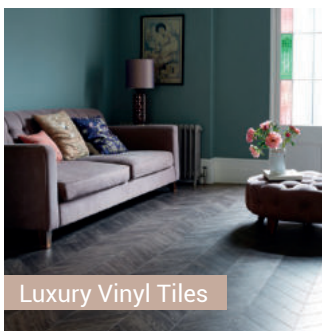
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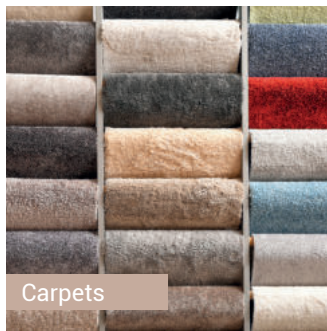

by the quieting of my mind.*

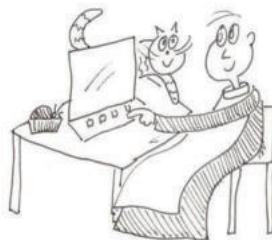
*Steady my hurried pace

RUSPER CHRONICLE

OAK TREES, BRICKS – AND AN INDIAN PRINCESS

Rusper was known for being good at growing oak trees – we have many still around, especially on the glebe field and the edge of the football field. Down the bottom of Averys land is a magnificent tree with huge branches stretching out in different directions. Instead of growing upwards it has spread around and is probably 400 or so years old. A bill of sale for Averys dated 1854 lists among other details its fine and growing oak trees – was this one of them? Oak trees were much in demand for building so perhaps they were like a cash crop? One fascinating fact amongst many about oak trees is that oak apples or galls were used to make ink for hundreds of years - and documents written in this ink are still clear to read.

On to bricks – another fascinating subject which we take for granted. There were no buildings of brick until the mid-1400s, though by the mid1500s they were becoming more common – but not in a rural backwater like Rusper. Averys, like most of the houses in the village, was made with wattle and daub initially, gradually replaced by bricks, possibly made locally from 1842 onwards. Not so well known is that the government of the day brought in a brick tax in 1784 till 1850 – this was in addition to the window tax and an earlier hearth tax. Early bricks were smaller, but some clever person thought that if bricks were made bigger that would save money – but the government was not having that and charged double tax on the larger bricks. We walked round the house spotting some of these developments - and looking at the beams too. Only two houses in Rusper were built with five bays, Averys and Porters – and Averys remains unchanged.

In between all this activity we sat in the garden sipping wine and hearing the story from Simon of the Indian princess who lived at Lower Beeding for many years and is buried in the church yard of St Mary's in Horsham facing towards Mecca.

Although not quite the sunny summer evening initially envisaged, it didn't rain on our annual summer outing – and we have lots more to explore about oak trees and bricks at a future meeting.

The combined Planning and Council Meeting took place on the 26th June 2023 Rusper Village Hall.

Agreed responses to the following planning applications.

Apologies

None.

Co-option of Councillor

It was **RESOLVED** to co-opt Marion Fenton on to the Council.

Declaration of Interests

No declarations were made.

Climate Emergency

To **acknowledge** that there is currently a climate emergency, and to ensure that all decisions made within meeting have consideration to this.

Minutes of previous meeting

It was **RESOLVED** to approve the Minutes of the previous Council meeting held on 16th May 2023 and the Planning meeting on 23rd May 2023. The Chair signed the minutes.

Open Forum

No members of the public were present.

Report from other Authorities

District Councillor Tony Hogben – advised the Parish Council to change ‘emergency’ to ‘crisis’ on the Climate Emergency section of the Agenda. An update was given on the status of the Faygate Garage site. An update was given on the Licence application. County Councillor Katie Nagel – WSCC are now working to a normal timeframe following a period of delayed response.

District Councillor Liz Kitchen – Noted the new Morrison store site is on hold due to water neutrality.

Active Planning Applications

DC/23/1149 Emily Cottage 7 Steeres Hill Rusper West Sussex RH12 4PT. Extension of existing first floor front dormer – no objection.

DC/23/1050 3 Chalice Walk High Street Rusper West Sussex RH12 4FA. Erection of a single-storey outbuilding within rear garden – objection.

DC/22/1358 Rose Cottage Charlwood Road Ifield Crawley West Sussex RH11 0JZ. Application to confirm the continuous use of Rose Cottage for House of Multiple Occupancy purposes for a period in excess of ten years (Lawful Development Certificate - Existing) – no objection. **DC/23/1031 Severn Cottage Charlwood Road Ifield West Sussex RH11 0JZ.** Demolition of existing porch and single storey side conservatory. Erection of a part two storey and part single storey side extension – no objection.

DC/21/2172 Land South of East Street Rusper West Sussex. Erection of 6 No. 3-bed dwellings (including 1 No. retirement property), with associated garages, creation of an access drive and landscaping works (Resubmission of DC/20/2454). To **note** extra reports added to the application – objection.

DC/23/1004 Land Adjacent To Saykers Faygate Lane Faygate Horsham RH12 4RF. Erection of 1no. dwelling with associated parking and amenity space – objection.

DC/23/0283 - Spinroute Ltd CCM Depot Rusper Road Ifield Crawley West Sussex RH11 0LQ. Noted application permitted. Letter issued to Planning.

Reports from Representatives

Cllr M Fillmore – report received in advance of the meeting noted and is added to website under the new 'Gatwick' section.

Cllr M Cooke- Horsham District Older Peoples Forum report received in advance of the meeting noted.

Cllr V Hanstad-Pilcher – feedback from a meeting with Police Inspector Neil Durken and Community Policing by the Community. Operation on anti-social driving is being enforced in this area, once the operation on North Horsham is complete. The local PCSO is now back on duty after a period of absence. Noted that the Licence application was addressed by the Police and the RPC objection was raised on the Council's behalf. Next Police meeting is on 20th July.

Cllr Ritchie Gatt – Feedback noted from the Horsham Incinerator liaison group. **Cllr Geoff Hussey** – Update on the Gatwick liaison group meeting the powerpoint from the event is to be circulated to the Council. Noted Gatwick railway construction is being completed by November and will be fully operational, a survey is being carried out every quarter and a request to include a question on where people park to travel has been raised.

Parish Playground – it was **agreed** that a cost of £70 plus VAT to purchase wood to repair the chat room.

Cllr George Sallows – Recreation Group – noted that the group are still trying to contact the Hurst family to get permission for the improvement works. The Sports Club are claiming the S106 money from HDC.

Cllr Gary Adams – reported that there is a signification road surface and pothole issues in Green Lane with the junction of Friday Street. All to be reported via the Clerk.

Public notice - licensing application - Licensing Act 2003

Harry William Albert Slade for a new Premises Licence for Ashfolds, Horsham Road, Rusper, HORSHAM, RH12 4QX The application proposes to apply for the following licensable activities, on Friday 1st, Saturday 2nd and Sunday 3rd September 2023. Noted that the Licence has now been issued.

Footpath No 1549_2 – Temporary Closure Notice (Issue 34920)

Report sent in advance of the meeting noted. It was **agreed** to ask where this footpath is on the list, which is being reviewed in August, why is it considered unsafe whereas the car park is seen as more dangerous and what is the future plan for the footpath is.

Rusper Conservation Area Update following Consultation process

Report noted and the Conservation area has been accepted.

Rusper Stores Recycling Bin

Following a meeting with the Rusper Store owner it was **proposed** that a new recycle bin should be installed outside the Stores to compliment the general waste bins. It was **agreed** the that cost of £499 for the new bin is acceptable with a local contact installing the bin.

Recreational Ground

It was **agreed** to accept the Purchase Order report as detailed and to **award** the works to Hedgehog. Noted that works to be completed by September.

Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group Committee

Cllr Fenella Maitland-Smith updated the Council on 19th June 2023 meeting. The NPSC recommended that the Council should write to the leaders of HDC Council with their concerns for the new Local Plan. A draft letter was issued to the Council in advance of the meeting. It was **resolved** to issue the letter with minor amendments made during the meeting straight after the meeting.

Transport Survey

The draft survey was issued in advance of the meeting. It was **agreed** that an informal working party should be formed so that the content requirements of the survey can be fed back. **Gatwick – meeting**

with Jeremy Quin MP

Noted feedback from Cllr Fillmore following the meeting with Jeremy Quin MP and a letter following up the meeting was considered by the Council. Reports were also received and will be updated onto the Council website. It was **agreed** to send the letter.

Financial

It was **RESOLVED** to approve the financial report, this was signed by the Chair. It was **RESOLVED** to approve the schedule of payments, this was signed by the Chair. **Future of Council and Planning Meeting**

It was **proposed** to combine Parish Council meetings into one meeting but to commence the meetings at 6.30pm. It was **agreed** to trial this at the July meeting and review again at the end of the meeting.

Action Clerk to re-advertise this meeting time change and to inform Village Hall bookings Clerk.

The date of next meeting is 25th July 2023 commencing at a new time of 6.30pm.
